Only Names to Use display in Yellow Bar (if none entered, Administrative Names display)

Administrative Sex (previously called Gender) no longer displays on the Yellow Bar

Core functionality that we can't change

Displays First Name to Use in brackets after Administrative Names

Pronouns can be entered & updated from the Yellow Bar

Gender Identity displays in the Clinical Details panel in the Medical Record

Gender Identity can be entered and updated from a New Encounter

Names and Administrative Sex can be entered and updated in the Client Registration Form

Pronouns and Gender Identity are not sent to PARIS, EMPI, or CareConnect at this time

Multiple values can be selected

This form is opened from the Yellow Bar

Pronouns can also be updated in the Client Registration Form

Multiple values can be selected

This form is opened from a New Encounter

Gender Identity can be viewed, entered, and updated from the Medical Record

There will be explanatory hover tips for Administrative Names, Names to Use, Administrative Sex, and Pronouns

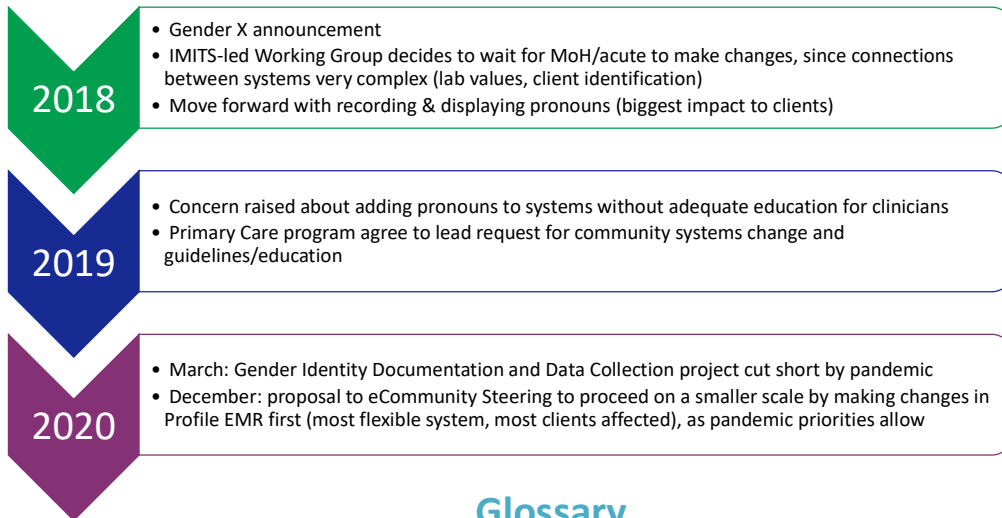
The way Profile EMR interfaces with other systems is NOT changing (PARIS, EMPI, CareConnect, Excelleris, etc.)

Administrative Sex – what sex marker is currently on your gov't issued ID?

Gender Identity – how do you identify in terms of your gender?

Pronouns – what are your pronouns?

Health outcomes for gender-diverse people improve

Electronic health record (EHR) systems promote inclusion and safety

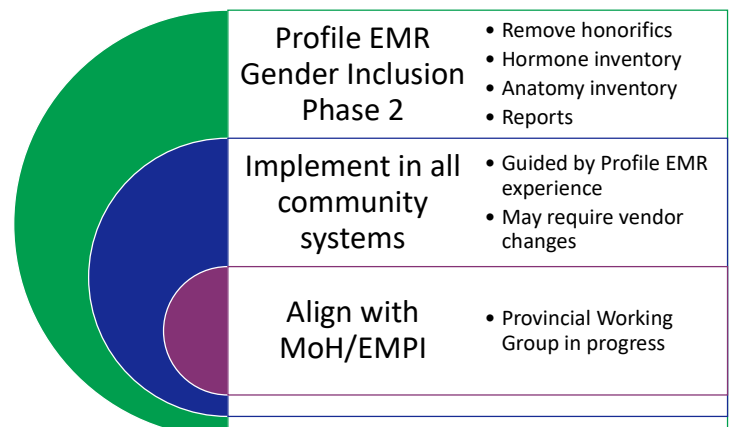
Gender-diverse clients access care

Meaningful data on sex/gender to understand client needs

Clients are addressed by the correct names, pronouns, gender(s)
